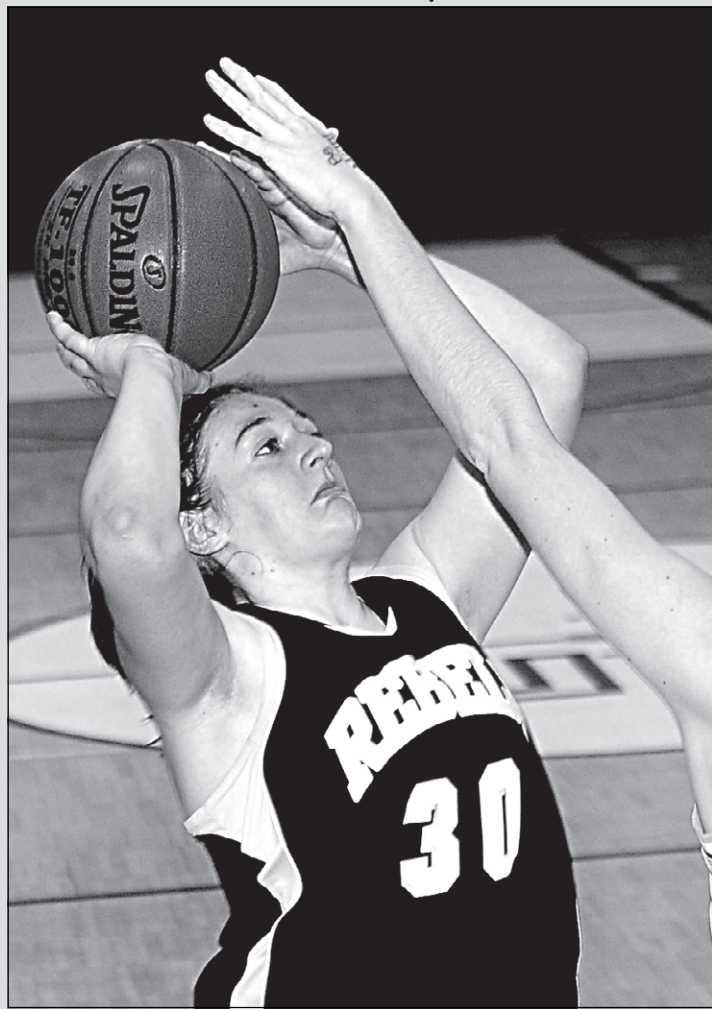


Lady Rebels drop two conference games

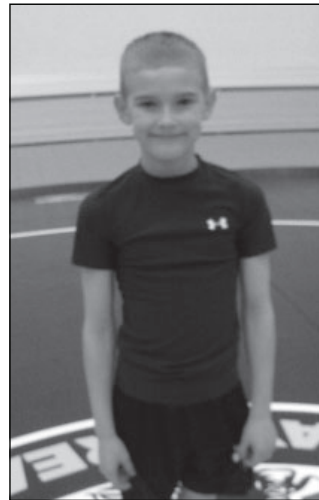
On Friday, the Browerville-Eagle Valley Broncos traveled to Osakis for an Invitational. The Broncos wrestled Pequot Lakes-

The Tigers fell behind 20-2 seven minutes into the game as they struggled to break the Silverstreak press on their way to a 57-34 defeat Tuesday night in Osakis.

The Silverstreak's offensive combination of Annalise Savageau and Becka Sadelmeyer scored 26 of the team's 30 points in the first half as Osakis led 30-13 at the break.

The Tigers played stronger in the second half and showed more consistency in their offense which allowed them to score 21 points.

Callahan played another solid game in the paint for Browerville and finished with a team high 12 points and 8 rebounds. Katelyn Middendorf continues to improve and produced seven points off the bench. Buhl and Buchta chipped in 5 points, while Katelyn Kellen and Quinn Kircher each dropped in a bucket.

Savageau finished with a game high 22 points for Osakis.

LPGE 44—Browerville 24

The Tigers and Thunder played a physical basketball game Friday night, but it was Long Prairie's strength and experience that eventually prevailed as they defeated the Tigers 44-24 in the Browerville gymnasium.

The Tigers defense played very strong in the first half as they held the Thunder to just seven field goals. LPGE took an 18-10 lead into halftime, but the Tigers cut the lead to 21-19 with 14 minutes left in the game.

The orange and black had a couple of chances to tie the game or take the lead, but three consecutive possessions with turnovers allowed the Thunder to take back control of the tempo and the game. Browerville quickly found themselves down by 10 after the turnovers and had to play man-to-man defense the remainder of the game against a big Thunder lineup.

Crystal Pearson rebounded with a nice performance chipping in 11 points and 4 assists. Fellow classmate Paige Callahan scored six points and pulled down eight rebounds. Kale Knutson connected on a triple, while Andi Buhl and Kendra Buchta each chipped in a bucket.

Tigers roll over Silverstreaks

Browerville 74—Osakis 61

Last Thursday night the Browerville Tigers gained a Prairie Conference victory over the visiting Osakis Silverstreaks, 74-61.

Browerville is now 4-1 in the conference and trails Long Prairie-Grey Eagle who improved to 7-0. The Tigers hold a one game lead over Eagle Valley and Upsala who are both at 4-2. On Tuesday, the Tigers travel to Long Prairie to take on the Thunder and then host Eagle Valley on Friday night.

Despite a 38 point performance by Osakis' Joe Roggenbuck, the Tigers were able to use some balanced scoring and free throws to defeat the Silverstreaks.

Browerville jumped out to an early 21-5 lead. Osakis then road the coattails of Roggenbuck as he scored 21 of their next 23 points. The Silverstreaks pulled within 12 points once in the half, but trailed 44-28 at the half. Roggenbuck finished with 23 points in the first half.

Kyle Petermeier connected on a 3-pointer early in the second half to give the Tigers a 19 point

lead. Jordan Mack answered with a 3-pointer for Osakis. The scoring slowed down for Browerville and with 6 minutes to play the Silverstreaks had snuck their way back to within six points of the Tigers.

Browerville's coach called a timeout to regroup the Tigers' defense. Over the next five minutes, Osakis would not score. Browerville went on to make 10 of 12 from the line to close this one out. With 1:36 left, Roggenbuck nailed a 3-pointer to bring the score to 67-59. The Tigers finished with free throws and Roggenbuck scored one last time for a final score of 74-61.

Roggenbuck finished the game with 38 points and 7 rebounds.

The Tigers had all five starters in double figures. Seth Christensen and Mitch Heid each scored 17. Heid also dished out 7 assists. Seth Kellen scored 12 points to go with 6 assists and 3 steals. Connor Burns and Kyle Petermeier had 11 and 10 points respectively. Browerville finished the game 21 of 31 from the charity stripe, including 17 of 21 in the second half.
